## Monthly outreach: Visit to MEGHIS & OKUAS

Our journey to empower Ghana's youth took us to Methodist Girls' High School, Mamfe, and Okuapemman School in the Eastern Region. From the moment we arrived, the excitement in the air was clear. The students' bright smiles and eager participation set the stage for a day of inspiration and learning.

#### **A Keynote on Overcoming Failure**

The day's highlight was a keynote address by Mr. Agya Yaw Nsiah, Director at the Youth Employment Agency. He shared his story of resilience, reflecting on times when he faced setbacks but found strength through discipline and persistence. His message encouraged the students to see challenges as opportunities to grow.

#### **New Voices, Fresh Lessons**

This outreach welcomed new resource persons, each sharing important lessons:

**Mr. Ernest Brakohiapa**, from the Minerals Commission Ghana, spoke about careers in the mining sector and emphasised the need for sustainable environmental practices.



## Monthly outreach: Visit to MEGHIS & OKUAS

**Dr. Gameli Aheto**, a doctor from Lister Hospital, highlighted the importance of personal hygiene, the risks of drug misuse, and specific health concerns for young women.

**Obaa-yaa Amponsah**, an entrepreneur and event consultant, inspired students with her journey to success and shared practical tips on personal growth and entrepreneurship.

#### **Support from Trusted Partners**

The Ghana Armed Forces and Ghana Maritime Authority continued to support our efforts, guiding students with insights into their fields and offering advice on how to pursue careers in their organisations.

### **Learning Through Interaction**

In smaller breakout sessions, students had the chance to ask questions and share their concerns. These sessions gave them personalised advice and practical tools to help them succeed.










































# Training for GES Guidance & Counseling Officers & DTI-A Volunteers

On Friday, 22nd November 2024, we held a one-day training workshop to equip GES Guidance & counselling officers from the Greater Accra Region's Ghana Education Service (GES) and volunteers from Drive to Inspire Africa (DTI-A) with the skills needed to support young people effectively.

In today's rapidly changing world, young people face increasing pressures from constant exposure to new experiences and expectations. Recognising the growing need for up-to-date approaches to counselling and education, we partnered with key stakeholders to deliver a workshop that addressed these challenges and equipped participants with practical tools for their work.

The event featured four key sessions, each tailored to address specific needs:

### Managing Adolescent Life, Overcoming Fear of Failure, and Bridging the Gap Between Authorities and Students

• Facilitator: *Karrielle Dansoh* (Sociology and Linguistics Student)
This session delved into the challenges of adolescence, offering strategies to help students overcome the fear of failure and approaches for effective discipline. A panel discussion with students provided real-life insights into bridging the gap between school authorities and learners.

Understanding Mental Health - Facilitator: Dr. Gladys Setordzie (Clinical Psychologist and Psychometrist)

Participants explored strategies to support students' mental well-being, learning how to address critical mental health challenges faced by young people today.

Career Guidance Strategies - Facilitator: *Mr. Kafui Ntow* (Group HR and Admin Director, Devtraco Group) This session offered actionable techniques for guiding students towards informed decisions about their career paths, empowering them to plan effectively for the future.

**Financial Literacy for Counsellors and Volunteers -** Facilitator: *Henry Nii Dottey, APR* (Head of Marketing & Corporate Communications, UBA Ghana)

Focusing on personal and professional financial management, this session provided tools to enhance financial stability for counsellors and volunteers.
