On Wednesday, 15th January 2025, and Friday, 17th January 2025, we visited Labone Senior High School and Accra Girls Senior High School, respectively. These visits provided a platform to engage with students, offer career guidance, and support their personal development through interactive and impactful sessions.

At Labone Senior High School, our team was warmly received during the school's morning worship period. Volunteers led discussions focused on career paths and personal growth, equipping students with practical tools to set and achieve their goals for the year. The students' engagement and curiosity were evident, and their enthusiasm energised the session. A highlight of the visit was witnessing the announcement of the newly elected prefects—a moment that reinforced the importance of leadership and responsibility.
